PHOTOSHOP FUN!

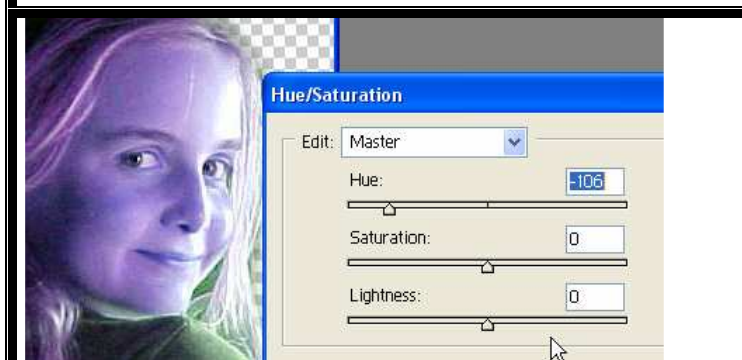


We're going to use Photoshop Elements & the digital camera to have some fun with YOUR picture!



Let's change up some colors...

Go to **Enhance - Adjust Color - Hue/Saturation**

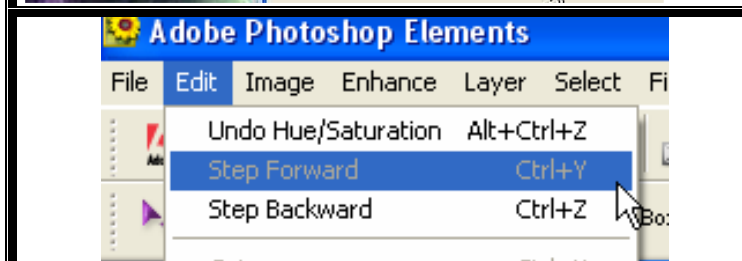


There's three sliders -

Hue - selects Color

Saturation - selects how much color - all the way to the right is psychedelic, and all the way to the left is black & white

Lightness - adds or takes away lightness...

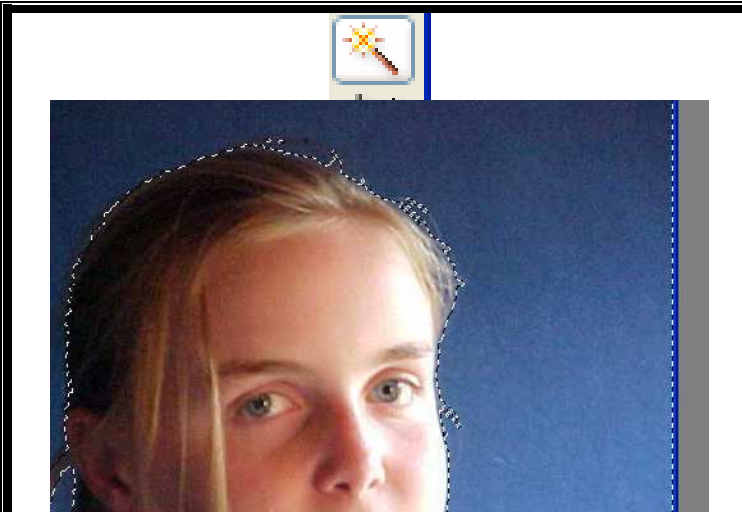


Don't be afraid to experiment!

Your best friend!

Click **Edit - Undo** to backstep out of what you've just done.

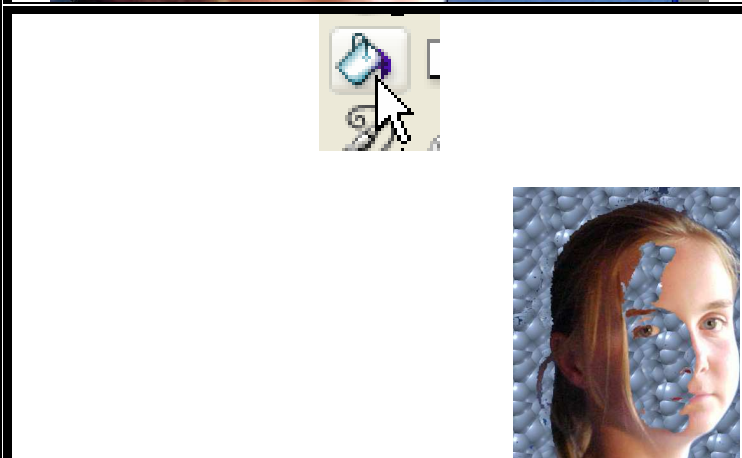
Click **Edit --- Step Backward** to backstep several steps



Use the **magic wand tool** to select areas by color - hold down the **SHIFT** key to keep adding colors to the selection.

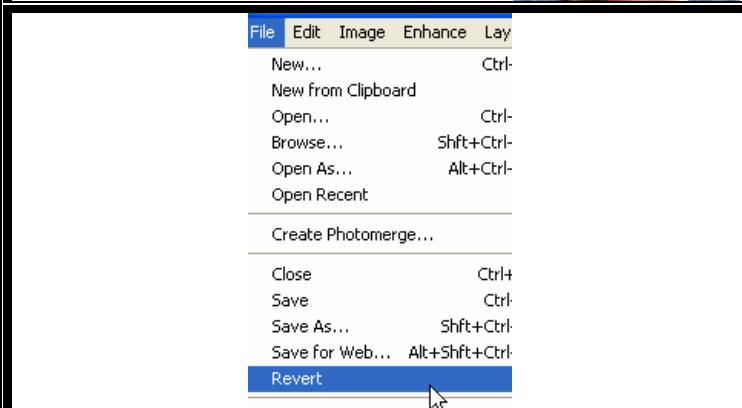
Here we've selected just the background.

Adjust **tolerance** up to include more variations in color

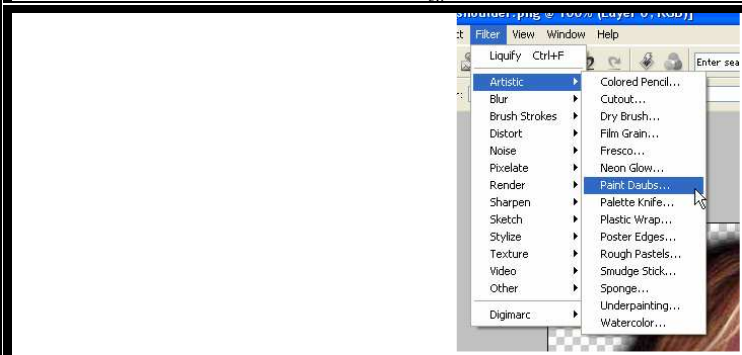
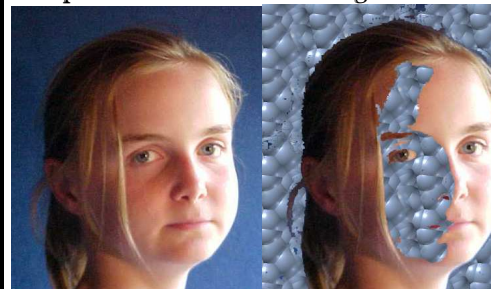


Use the bucket to pour in color..

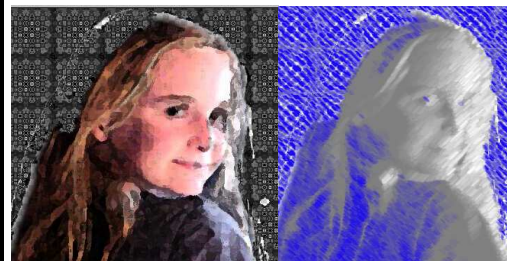
Or patterns...

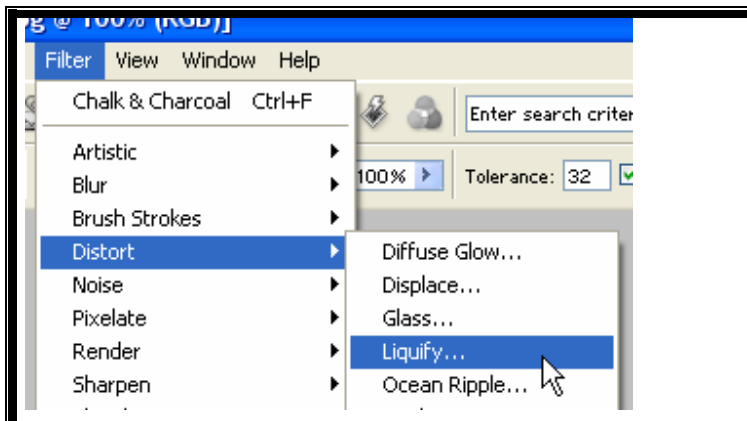


You can always choose **File – Revert** to get the picture back to the original

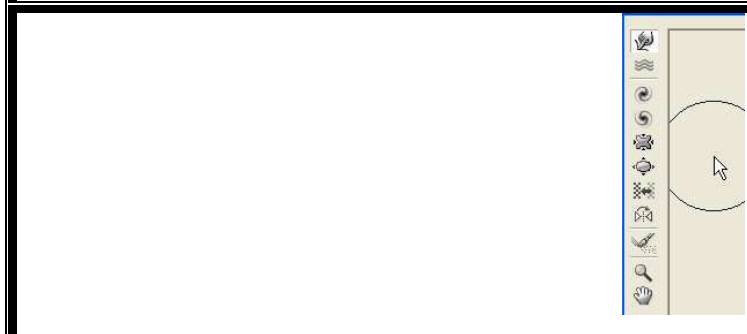


Use Filters to get interesting effects!

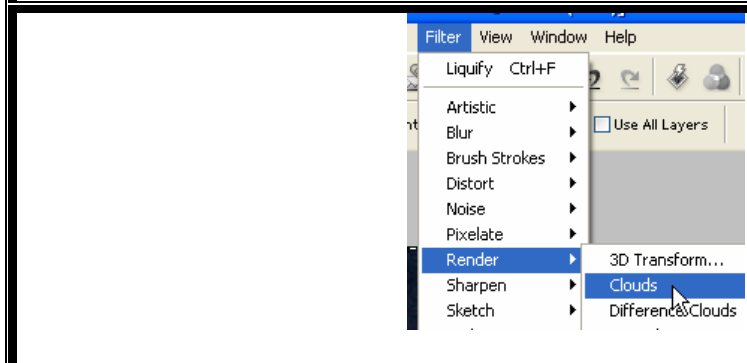




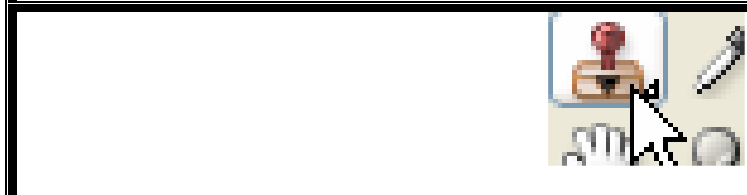
A fun filter is the "Liquify" filter:



Don't forget to use the variations in effects with the tools at the far left...



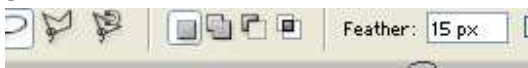
Another fun filter is Clouds - select the background using the magic wand...



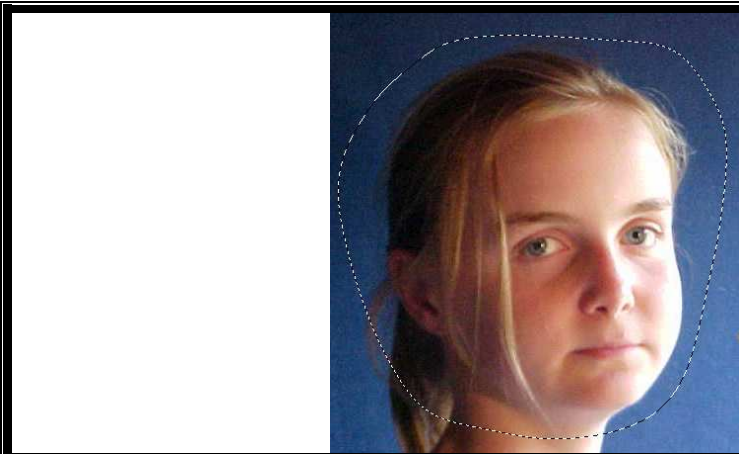
Use the Clone Stamp tool to airbrush out stuff - hold down the ALT key and select the area you want to paint with, then brush with that area



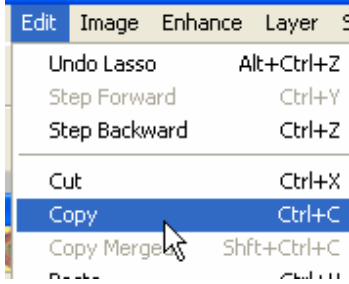
To get a formal portrait look, use the Lasso tool...



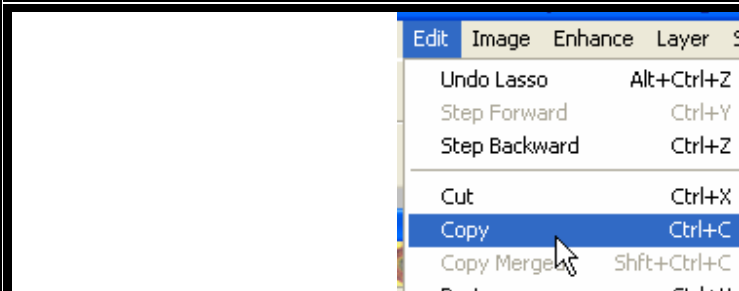
Choose a degree of "feathering"



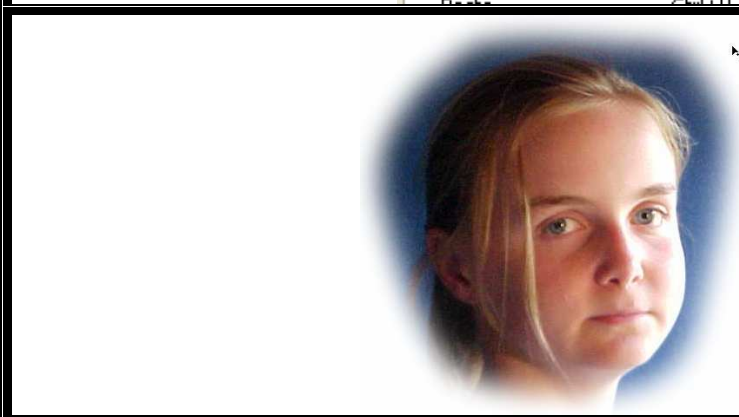
Draw around what you want to keep...



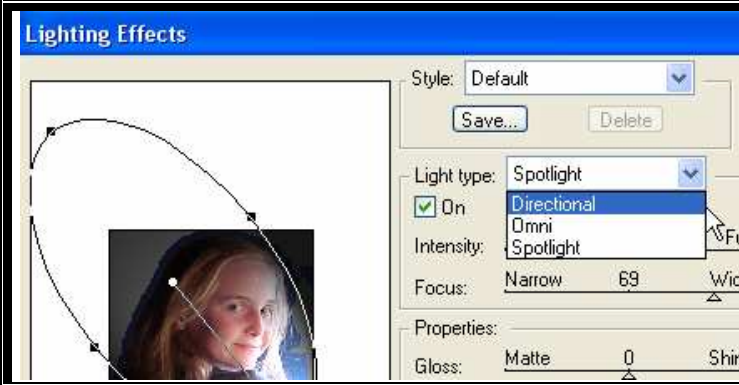
Click **Edit - copy...**



Click **File - New** - to create a new document - it'll automatically be about the right size...



Click **Edit - Paste**, and you'll see the feathering effect...



Use **Filter - Render - Lighting Effects** to get some other professional-looking effects!
