

READY FOR MY CLOSE-UP ANIMATIONS!

	<p>This is a two-step process.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• First, we'll remove the background from a picture;• Next, we'll create a new picture with fun original backgrounds & strange hair 
	<p>Your Magic Assistant – Edit – Undo</p>  <p>Don't be afraid to experiment – you can always Edit-undo your last step.</p>
<p>Here are the important tools:</p>  <p>The Crop tool will select just the part you want to keep - just select and double-click</p>	<p>First, let's learn how to remove the background from a picture:</p> 



The **Magic Wand**

Tool selects areas by color
Select areas you want to remove and hit the DELETE key



If the Tool Options box for the magic wand tool isn't open, you can open it by double-clicking.


If the magic wand selects **too much**, you can adjust the tolerance level to a lower number

In the Edge box, you can choose **feather** to get a glow-y look...




At some point, it's easier to select areas to delete with **the lasso tool**

Tip – after you've selected an area, that selection can




be moved around to other areas...





Just drag and select

and delete.



You may also want to change the view to be able to see in closer detail what you're doing...






When you've removed the background, save the picture to the closeup folder inside the WFY folder on the W: drive.



Give it a name you'll remember, cause you'll hafta find it again

Step two - the animation

Create a new document





Create it around 750 x 750 pixels, which is around 8" x 8"



Now bring in the picture of yourself...

Go to **Insert** and pull down to **Image**. Find the picture of yourself that you saved...






Click **Open** and you get a little half square thing - click and drag this to the size you want your picture to be...

If you're planning to do crazy hair, put the picture towards the bottom of the picture.

When there's a blue line around your picture, that means you can change it - you can move it around and re-size it



Go to Window and pull down to Frames to open up our animation menu




Now for more of the animation part...


There's a little triangle at the top right of the Frames menu - click on that and another menu pops out...

Choose Duplicate Frame - choose as many as 10 frames...





Click on Frame 2 and notice that your picture is still there in the new frame...



Let's do something fun with the background...

Open the Fill window...




Choose Pattern in the top drop-down box, then look at the available fills in the second drop-down box.

Choose one.



Making sure your picture is selected (when the blue box is showing), pour your fill inside the blue box.





Find the VCR style controls and play the movie - note that your picture seems to move between Frame 1 and 2.

Now go to the different frames and change your picture's position in each one.




You can also select the hair with



the Lasso Tool and then pour a fill in for new hair - here it's leaves

Experiment with other Fills in the Fills drop-down boxes - this one is Ellipse - see box for exactly how this effect was achieved



Let's draw in some Wacky Hair!

Choose the Paintbrush tool at the



Switch to the Stroke tab at the top.



See the blue line? That means it's selected, and you can make changes to it in the Stroke selection box and

Subselection tool




Choose different strokes, sizes, tips, and textures to get different wacky hair, then just draw it in with the paintbrush!






This has 2 effects - a fill and a stroke highlight in the hair.




With the Subselection tool, you can change up parts of the stroke after you've drawn it – click and drag on the dots



If you want to **save** your animation, you'll need to follow these directions

First, go to File - Export Preview



Make sure to select "Animated GIF" as the format.

And click the Export button



Be sure to save as type - **HTML & images**

Save to the WFY drive first, and then we'll move the final to a disk.

Go to the A: drive and click on the HTML file, which should look like the blue internet E in the picture.

Your animation will play in an IE window.
