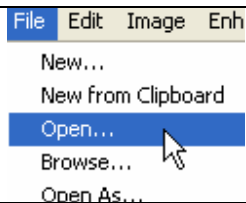


How scary can you get? Let's use Photoshop to find out...

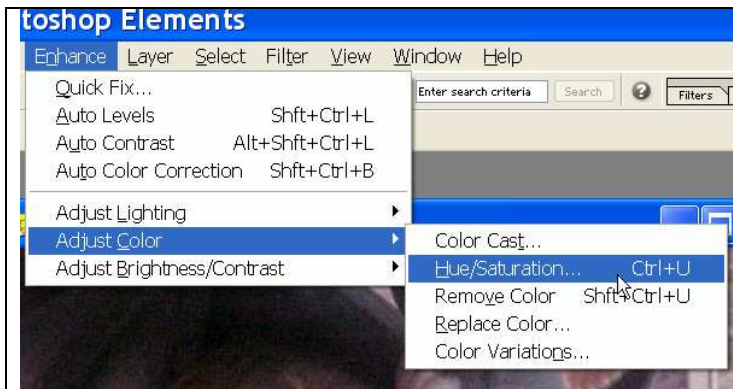
We'll also learn how to turn your finished project into a coloring page - print it out and do some creepy coloring!

We'll Open Photoshop Elements
We're using Photoshop Elements 2.0



Click File—Open and choose which picture you want to change up.

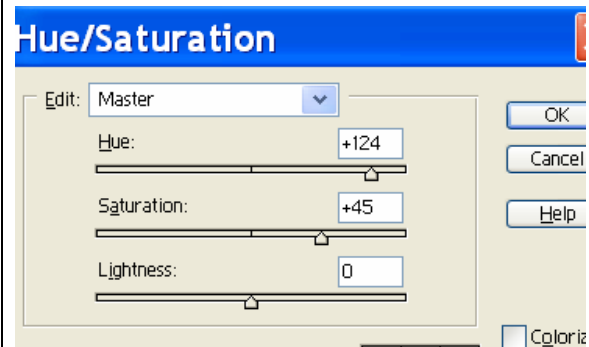


Let's turn somebody into a scary green monster...

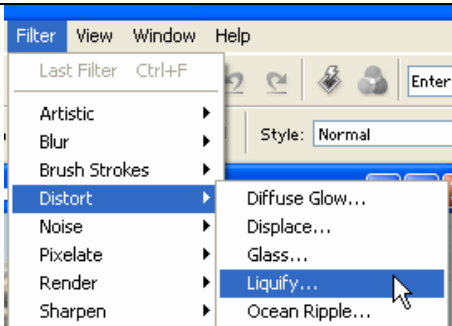
We'll turn her green...
Enhance...Adjust
Color...Hue/Saturation



These changes will get you that result...

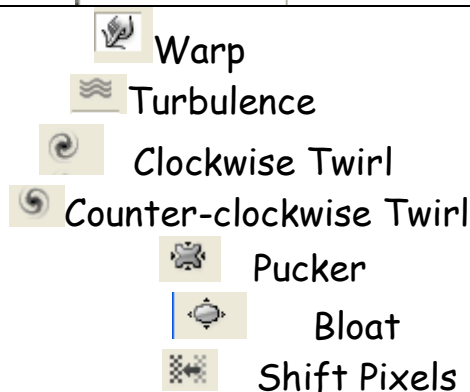


Hue - 124; Saturation - 45
Adjust the settings to get the result you want...





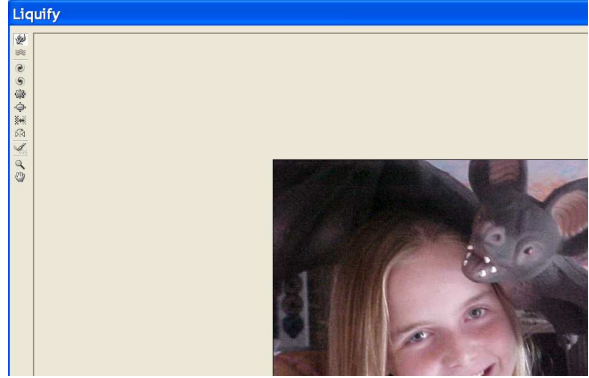
Now let's make some really bizarre changes...

Click on Filter—Distort—Liquify.



You'll see a lot of tools at the left.

 Reflection
 Reconstruct Tool



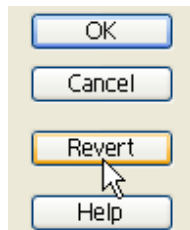
We'll learn them all.



For fun, let's use the



Warp  tool and liquefy, with a result sorta like this:

Now look at the menu on the right - you can choose to Revert




When you click the **Revert** button, the picture will go back to the beginning.




Warp  again, and this time use the **Reconstruct** Brush  to revert just parts of the picture.



The **Turbulence** Tool  scrambles the pixels ...




Use the **Twirl** tools   to make weird eyes and a crooked nose...



Use the **Pucker** Tool  to pucker up the mouth & chin...


or around the eyes...




Use the **Bloat** tool  to make a really big brain...
...or teeth






Use the **Shift Pixels** tool  to get some really strange effects...

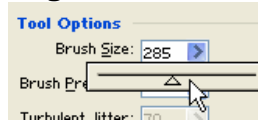




The **Reflection** tool  makes copies of different areas of the picture, with interesting results.

Keep stirring and see what you come up with! It's fun to use the **Reconstruct** Brush  to revert just parts of the picture



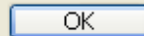
Make a pin-head! My favorite - first, change the size of the



brush:  Make it big enough to cover the whole head. Then use the **Pucker** Tool  to shrink...

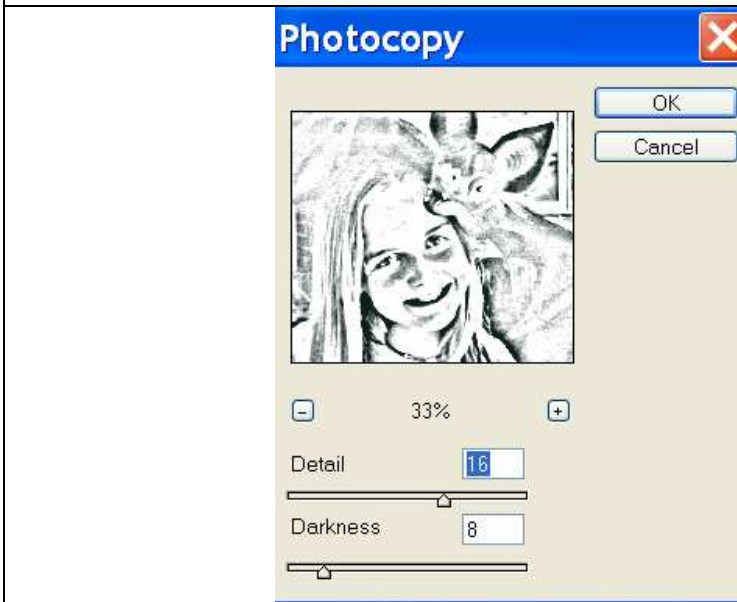
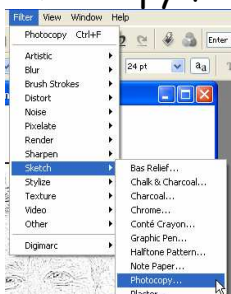


If you like your result, click OK



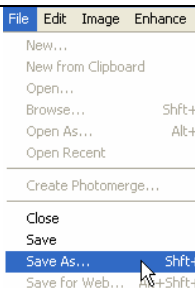


If you'd like to make your creation into a coloring page, where you can get some really terrific artistic results, try one of the Sketch filters - this is the Photocopy filter.



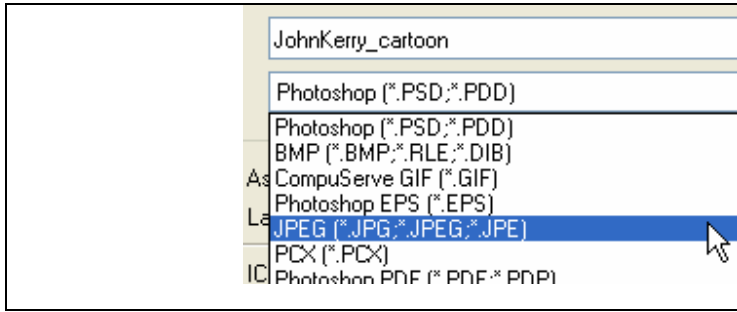
Play with the Detail and Darkness adjustments until you get the effect you want...

TO SAVE:



Select File—Save AS
